



Bringing Healing to Children's Learning and Behaviour

a new Academy of Inner Science (AIS) initiative

Berlin, evening of Wednesday 29th September 2010

Many children and teenagers find it hard to engage with learning. The pressure in schools and families to 'get things right' is considerable, which creates even more pressure in a child. Now there are new holistic and systemic resources available for schools, teachers, educationalists, youth workers and parents who want to identify the roots of a problem, and to empower the families and children in their care.

In the approach which we will demonstrate during this session, we explore the bigger picture behind a child's school or family situation - revealing hidden relationships between important people and events, stimulating new thinking and insights about creative ways forward, and facilitating healing. Parents, teachers, youth workers and other professionals may attend to explore issues on behalf of children or teenagers. There are usually several issues worked on during a session.

We have extended the work of Bert Hellinger by integrating Thomas Hübl's teachings in presence and evolutionary potential (see: www.thomashuebl.com/index.php?lang=en), as well as recent lessons learned from schools, social agencies, and communities in Great Britain, the Netherlands and the USA, where these powerful new systemic tools have been pioneered. The work broadens our view of what it means to be human - going far beyond children's cognitive development to embrace other aspects of their selfhood. We focus on their health and wellbeing as well as on their learning and achievement - and on their evolutionary potential, and that of the systems in which they are a part. The approach is called ecl (emotional welfare, creativity and learning) and it has been pioneered by the British-based not-for-profit 'nowhere foundation': www.now-here.com/ecl

The session will be facilitated by Stephen Busby, a nowhere associate who is based in Scotland at the Findhorn community: an international centre for holistic education, where he is working on new forms of deep-systems healing. He will be assisted by Anjet Eich from TransParents (a programme to deepen family bonds: www.transparents.net), and by Heidi Tiedemann who works with Stephen at the AIS to explore collective intelligence and innovation in leadership and learning communities, running an inquiry programme into the potential for awakened cultures of work.

We will be working in English, with German translation provided informally when necessary, and we will be creative linguistically - ensuring that basic needs are met. We request that you have a minimum basic level of working English.
